

- Concert Band & Cream tea afternoon, Saturday 13th July. We will be welcoming Morley & District Concert Band to our cream tea afternoon on the church field. It should be a wonderful afternoon of refreshments and music!

Following the recent announcement that Bishop Tony will be retiring this summer, we are delighted that the Bishop of Leeds, Nick Baines, will be coming to our 10am service instead. The original St Peter's church was opened on 6th September 1824, before it was greatly damaged by the 1911 fire. During the weekend we will also be having a flower festival and other

activities.

### Stained glass window restoration

During the year we hope to restore our stained glass window and have it ready in time for the service on 8th September. Donations towards this are very welcome. The total cost of restoring the window is around £1,500 and about half of this

**Dear Friends,** As I pen this letter, it is wonderful to report that on Sunday 28th April it was announced across the Benefice that Revd Diane Komorowski will be joining us this summer as our new Associate Priest. For the past three years, Diane has served as curate in Lupset and Thornes and spent a couple of months with us at the start of the year on placement. The placement was a lovely opportunity to get to know Diane and for her to experience the breadth of worship across the benefice and the enthusiasm and potential in the benefice and in each church. Diane brings a lot of experience to the post, both from her church life, daily life and also her work background. It is a very exciting next stage in the life of the benefice and during the autumn we shall be spending time together praying, discussing and planning how we develop and deepen our shared lives and witness in our respective villages.

In the meantime please remember Diane and her family as she prepares to move into the vicarage in Wrenthorpe and take up this new post. With regards other moves—on Sunday 5th May at 3.30pm in Wakefield Cathedral we will welcome our new Archdeacon, Revd Canon Cat Thatcher, and in early July, Bishop Tony who has been in the diocese for well over 20 years will retire; his final service is on Saturday 6th July at 11.00am in Wakefield Cathedral.

Turning to other news and by the time you read this our annual general meetings in each of the four churches will have been completed. For each church there is a great deal of work to be undertaken to look after the fabric of the buildings, prepare and lead services, run church groups and social events, look after the money and pay the bills, keep up to date with all the legalities....the list goes. We are all thankful to those who in many ways work behind the scenes to make sure we are 'open for business' on Sunday mornings and mid-week – thanks to everybody who offers themselves in any way to serve in our churches.

Finally, on Thursday 9th May we have Ascension Day we shall gather as a benefice for a joint service in St Anne's, Wrenthorpe and reflect on Jesus returning to the Father after 40 days when he met with the disciples and followers in different settings. Again this year we shall be joining in the global

ecumenical prayer movement (Thy Kingdom Come) that unites Christians from across the world to pray for people to come to faith. On Sunday 5th May there will be prayer booklets available for all the congregation to take home and use in their own personal prayer times from Ascensiontide until Pentecost — please make sure you pick your copy up and together let's pray for people to come to know Jesus.

### Ascension Day Service 7.30pm on Thursday 9th May at St Anne's

Everyone across the benefice is welcome to our Ascension day service which will be at St Anne's in Wrenthorpe and will be led by Rev Glenn Coggins. Join us as we remember that as Jesus was raised to God's right hand, we are called to be his disciples here on earth.

### Women of Substance ....

Women of Substance is a monthly meeting at St Anne's Church; all are welcome. As the title suggests, the group looks at the roles of women in Jesus' time. Last month, we studied Mary of Bethany: the sister of Martha and Lazarus; a deeply faithful and loyal devotee and friend of Jesus. When she washed the feet of Jesus by pouring a whole jar of perfume over them, much to the shock of everyone watching, she was unwittingly anointing His feet prior to His crucifixion. From His death to His resurrection and life in all it's glory.

We then discussed death and how we all are touched by it. I now write from a personal perspective. On January 20th this year my niece, Karen, died at the age of sixty after a year long struggle with a particularly aggressive form of leukaemia. She had a successful stem cell transplant at Sheffield Royal Hallamshire hospital last summer and everyone thought she would recover. (The medical team were wonderful and gave Rolls-Royce healthcare) But sadly the leukaemia came back in autumn. As you can imagine the whole family: her husband, daughter, son, brother, mother and all her relatives and friends were deeply saddened and asked how this could be? What helped us were these words from a daily newspaper which came at just the right time (God sent?): "Death is not the end. Ritual is important and even

### **Bishop Tony Robinson to retire**

Rt Rev Tony Robinson, Bishop of Wakefield, will be retiring this summer after

42 years of ordained ministry. His final service will be at 11am on Saturday 6th July at Wakefield Cathedral, to which all are invited.



Tony was born and educated in Bedford. He taught mathematics and computer studies in Chelmsford before training for the priesthood. His first parish was in Tottenham, then in Leicester he worked in a large team parish setting up community projects. The parish embraced a wonderful mix of peoples, including the largest Hindu community in Britain.

Bishop Tony moved to West Yorkshire in 1997 firstly as the Archdeacon of Pontefract and since 2002 as the Bishop of Pontefract in the Diocese of Wakefield.

He has extensive interfaith involvement and regularly meets with other Faith communities in Wakefield. He chairs our diocesan links with Tanzania and Pakistan, and also chairs the national Church of England Presence and Engagement task group which supports the Church's mission in areas with large ethnic communities.




### **Prayers for May**

### Roger Bannister and the Four Minute Mile


It was 70 years ago, on 6th May 1954, that Roger Bannister became the first person to run a mile in under four minutes (3 minutes, 59.4 seconds), in Oxford. Before then, a four minute mile was thought to be a physical impossibility. Just 23 days later, on 29th May, Diane Leather became the first woman to run a mile in under five minutes (4 minutes, 59.6 seconds), in Birmingham.

These were both momentous achievements, though Diane Leather, born in Staffordshire, received far less recognition than Oxford-born Bannister. At the time women did not compete in major events over more than 200 metres; so she was not allowed to compete at the Olympics. The following year she beat her own record and ran a mile in 4:45.0, which remained a world record until 1962.

Bannister's world record is one of the most widely known in athletics, and he continued to produce top performances, beating his Australian rival John Landy in Vancouver and taking the European title before retiring to concentrate on medical research, and becoming



a neurologist. He was knighted by the Queen in 1975. A lifelong Christian, he died in 2018, as did Diane Leather – coincidentally the daughter of a surgeon.
