

The most beautiful story

A well-known atheist was being interviewed on Radio 4. When asked how he spent Christmas, he said he went to Midnight Mass at church. "But you're an atheist", his interviewer protested. "Yes", he replied, "but what they celebrate at Christmas is the most beautiful story ever told."

That 'beautiful story' tells of a Creator who sent His Son to be born as a helpless baby, to grow up as a man of extraordinary wisdom, gentleness and love, who was executed by the authorities for contradicting the traditions of the time. His followers, who today number about two billion people all over the world, believe that He rose from the dead, and that by His death and resurrection He has made possible forgiveness and eternal life for men and women everywhere.


It is perhaps the greatest story ever told, and yes it is beautiful. And that is the story that will be retold again this Christmas, in nativity plays, in hymns and

carols, in Bible readings and sermons all over the country. People who stay away from church all year turn up to hear it, and who can blame them? This is a story of hope, of love and of heaven touching earth.

One of the best-known statues in the world is 'Christ the Redeemer', towering over the South American city of Rio de Janeiro, his arms outstretched in blessing. Christmas celebrates the birth of that great Redeemer – a tiny baby laid in a feeding trough. His birth changed history, His life transformed our understanding of what it means to be human, His death was at one and the same time a tragedy and a triumph. 

Dear Friends, By now most people will know that Angela and myself will be leaving the benefice at the end of February 2025. My actual last day of full time ministry will be on Friday 28th February after nearly thirty years serving in various churches around the country. Looking back it's hard to believe that in July 1986 our Vicar at the time asked if I had ever thought of being ordained? That started a journey which led to selection for training for ordination in the autumn of 1992, followed by a two year course at Cranmer Hall in St John's, Durham the following September. We left Durham in the summer of 1995 with Angela heavily pregnant with our twins Bethany and Samuel who arrived into the world in October that year. By then I was serving a curacy in Warminster in Wiltshire which led onto seven years in the Fens in Cambridgeshire before working our way 'back up north' in 2006 to serve at St Michael's in East Ardsley until joining the benefice here in June 2019.

It is now time to stand down from full time ministry and move into retirement which will see us start a new life in Bridlington on the east coast. It has been a privilege and honour to serve in the benefice these past five and a half years and we are both very sad to be leaving. Nobody likes change but with Diane now on board and a very committed and gifted group of church members I am sure the benefice can go from strength to strength as it moves into a new stage in its life. This obviously brings on another vacancy and the Archdeacon is fully aware of the time-scales and has already thought about plans to fill the vacancy.

In the meantime please be assured that Angela and myself will continue sharing our lives with you all until our paths go separate ways. You will always have a special place in our hearts and we shall continue to remember you in our prayers.

As we journey towards Christmas, please join us in worship and the many social events and activities taking place across the churches as we prepare to welcome the Christ child into our hearts.

Remembering the Boxing Day Tsunami of 2004

It is nearly twenty years since the Boxing Day Tsunami which occurred on 26th December 2024. It was one of the deadliest natural disasters in recorded history, killing more than 230,000 people in 14 countries. A massive undersea earthquake near Sumatra caused a devastating tsunami that swamped coastal areas in Indonesia, Sri Lanka, India, Thailand and East Africa. Waves generated by the earthquake travelled at 500mph and reached 50ft high in places. Aftershocks continued to shake the region daily for up to four months afterwards, and the effects of the tsunami were felt as far away as Somalia, 2,800 miles away. Since this devastating catastrophe, Australia has led the world in developing scientific monitoring and warning plans to improve the detection of tsunamis and to warn communities at risk.



Christmas Pudding coins

The tradition of putting silver coins into Christmas puddings dates from the Middle Ages. The first coins were a silver farthing or penny. After WW1, it

became a threepenny bit and then a sixpence. Finding one was supposed to bring you good fortune,

but probably it was more likely to break a tooth as you bit into the pudding! We also traditionally give chocolate coins to children at Christmas, and also during Hanukkah in the Jewish community. It is said that one night Saint Nicholas climbed on a roof and threw a purse of money down a chimney, which landed in a pair of stockings that a little girl had hung up to dry. Good throw Santa!
